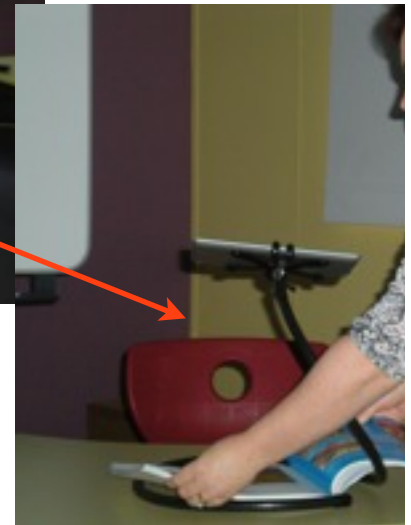
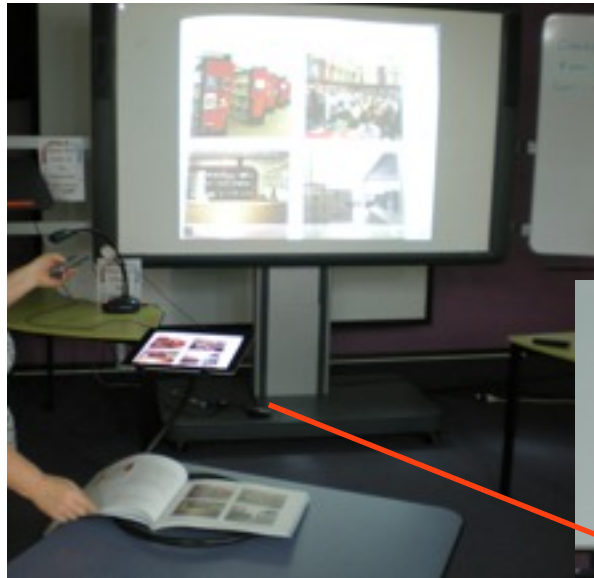


Using the iPad as a visualiser/ document camera

If you do not have a dedicated document camera, schools can easily use an iPad for this purpose. Useful for shared reading with students to display the book to all. Also useful in staff meetings for sharing information from books.



How does it work?

You use the camera functionality of the iPad to view the book. You will need the iPad to be on a stand above the book and then the camera App will be able to display the book. You can then connect your iPad either to a data projector or wirelessly via Apple TV to show the book on a screen.

You do need the grapple pro accessory with it as this keeps it firmly attached and able to swivel. Cost: \$99 + \$15 for grapple pro attachment.
